# Berford Street Reconstruction and Streetscaping Improvement Project George Street to Division Street

## What's happened since the last newsletter?

The Contractor, Bridge Excavating Ltd., has completed all of the water service reconnections except for one property.

Dewatering treatment was removed from the site as it is no longer required. Regular dewatering is being prepared at the proposed stormwater quality control device at Division St.

Hydro One has provided verbal direction to the contractor in the absence of detailed drawings.

Shallow utility ducts are being installed.

Road subgrade was prepared and gravel application (to lay the structural base for the asphalt) began. 6" perforated subdrain was installed under the curb line.

Shoring for the pit required to install the stormwater quality control device was initiated. Shoring holds the walls of the pit up.

## What's coming up next?

Completion of the placement of road subdrain and Fine grading of "B" gravel.

Installation of mountable curb-for barrier between travelled portion of roadway and parking areas

Installation of the rest of the slide-rail pit shoring system.

Dewatering for the large stormwater quality control device pit, and placement of Storm Quality Control Unit (Oil-Grit Separator - OGS)

- Berford Street is closed to vehicle traffic between the parkette (south of William Street) and north of Division Street.
- Berford Street from the parkette (south of William) to George is open to local traffic only as it is now "no exit".
- Division Street from Berford Street to Bayview Drive is closed.
- The Beer Store is accessible from the north end of Wiarton only. Please use the detours provided and access Berford Street from Jenny Street/County Road 13.

Customer access to the businesses is provided via side streets, rear parking lots and pedestrian access. If you require special accommodation, please contact the business owner or the Project Ambassador for current accessibility conditions.

Business owners needing accommodation for deliveries should contact the Project Ambassador.

Access for emergency vehicles will always be maintained.
